

# MISSISSIPPI ABSENTEE VOTING WHILE IN COLLEGE

If you are a student who resides on a college campus and is a registered MS voter in another county, you are eligible to vote by absentee ballot.

## IN-PERSON ABSENTEE VOTING IN MS

Absentee voting is available for any local, state, or federal election in your Circuit Clerks office. You can vote absentee in-person from 8am to 5pm, Monday through Friday, beginning September 23, 2024. The deadline to vote in-person absentee will be Saturday, November 2, 2024 from 8am to 12pm.

## ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATION

You can obtain this application from your county's circuit clerk's office. Once the application is submitted, the Clerk will provide an official absentee ballot and ballot envelope.

Once the application is completed, you must sign the back of the absentee ballot across the flap of the envelope, and the clerk will sign across the flap as a witness.

In-person absentee ballots must be submitted before the in-person absentee voting deadline, **Saturday, November 2, 2024**.

## ABSENTEE BALLOT APPLICATION

Mail-In absentee voting is available as of Monday, September 23, 2024. Mail-In absentee ballots must be postmarked by election day (November 5, 2024) and received no later 5 business days after the election.

Request an official application for mail-in absentee voting by contacting your circuit clerk's office.

You must ensure the bottom of the application is signed by a notary public who will serve as a witness. However, if you are temporary or permanently physically disabled, the application can be witnessed by a person who is at least 18 years of age.

Upon the completion of the application, mail it back to your circuit clerk's office. Once it is received, the circuit clerk will mail you an official absentee ballot within one business day.

Please be sure to read and follow the instructions attached to the ballot.

Upon receipt of the ballot, complete the ballot in front of a witness (notary public), place it in the envelope, seal it, and complete the voter affidavit on the back of the envelope. The witness (notary public) must sign the bottom of the envelope. However, if you are temporary or permanently physically disabled, the ballot envelope can be witnessed by a person who is at least 18 years of age.

Be sure to mail the envelope back to your circuit clerk's office.

*Please note: If you request to vote by mail-in absentee closer to election day, the application and the ballot may be mailed together.*
